Arts in our schools are such a valuable component for students. A well rounded education that includes the Arts is

linked to academic achievement. social and emotional growth as well as improvement in public speaking. Many



students who would not be the most outgoing in class will shine in the Arts. Personalities blossom and a renewed sense of self confidence is seen. I enjoy attending student plays, concerts and musicals just to see the variety of students involved. In Bradlev County, I am amazed at the student talent that is present. If you attend a Friday night football game, you all know the musical talent on the field is remarkable.

Entertainment is one facet of the Arts. but there is so much more benefit for students. A recent study of high schoolers revealed a correlation between arts education and math and writing test scores. Over a three year period high school students who took at least one extra class in the Arts were 1.5 times more likely to meet or exceed the ACT Plan national average composite score! These students excelled in statewide tests, earning proficient levels in math, reading and

Bradley County Elementary Honor Choir Performance


Bradley County Schools kicked off Music In Our Schools Month with the Seventh Annual Honor Choir performance on Thursday, March 1, 2018. Ten students in 4th or 5th grades from each of the eleven county elementary schools participated in the mass choir under the direction of guest clinician LuAnn Holden. Holden is an associate professor of music at Lee University and chair of the Department of Music Education.

The mission of Bradley County Honor Choir is to enrich the lives of participating students and audiences by preparing the mind and body to make beautiful music through rehearsal and performance of high quality literature, and to unite the Bradley County community through the arts. This evening of wonderful choral music was sponsored in part by Allied Arts of Cleveland-Bradley County.

An Evening of Irish Music

On April 6th, at 6:30pm at the Arnold Elementary School auditorium, students from Michigan Avenue and Arnold School will present a concert entitled, "An Evening of Irish Music" with guest artist, Siobhan O'Donnell, from Dublin, Ireland. This event was inspired from a Fund for Teachers Grant given to Cara Rogers and Siema Swartzel, Music Specialists at these schools. Last summer, Siema and Cara traveled to Ireland for the purpose of taking traditional music classes on both the Tin Whistle and Bodhran (Irish frame drum). While there, one of the Bodhran instructors, Siobhan O'Donnell, agreed to come over to Cleveland and do a week-long Bodhran workshop with the students at MAS and Arnold. Through generous grants from Allied Arts Council and Bradley Cleveland Public Education Foundation, the teachers were able to buy a classroom set of Bodhrans and Tin Whistles for their students, as well as fund the trip for Ms. O'Donnell. Ms. O'Donnell's residency will begin on Monday, April 2nd, with a free Bodhran class for music instructors in the area at Michigan Avenue School. It will continue the rest of the week, with O'Donnell instructing the students at both elementary schools in Bodhran daily. The Friday concert for the community will be the culmination of the week-long residency and is free of charge to the public.

WVHS Musicians selected to All-State Recital

Caleb Presley and Ryan Williams will be representing the Walker Valley High School Band and the East Tennessee School Band & Orchestra Association at the Tennessee Music Educators' Association Conference in Nashville, TN this year. On Wednesday, April 11, the two Walker Valley percussionists will be performing Ivan Trevino's "2+1" for band directors and students during the Tennessee Bandmasters Association Honors Recital. This annual event only includes one ensemble from each regional association (East, Middle, and West) and the participants are selected from a recorded audition process. Trevino's "2+1" is composed for two marimbists on one marimba but the players face each other while performing. Meaning, one of the players performs on the opposite side of the instrument and essentially plays the keyboard upside down (while holding 4 mallets!!). From the composer, "There are many percussionists around the world who only have access to one marimba like me! I decided to write a piece that would allow two marimbists to play a duet utilizing one marimba." Ryan is a junior at Walker Valley and a two time TN All State Band Member. Caleb is a WVHS senior and plans to major in music at the University of Tennessee at Knoxville. The two students worked the advanced percussion piece up with help from director Colby Burris. This is one of the many examples of high quality music being practiced and performed in our local schools here in Bradley County. The video shows the two performing the piece for Walker Valley's Humanities Weekly Concert Series in the stairwell during class change.

Grants awarded to Lake Forest Band

The Lake Forest Middle School Band has been awarded two grants from the Bradley Cleveland Public Education Foundation over the last two years. The first project, "Restoring Instruments for Creative Minds", repaired 19 school-owned instruments consistently used by students as primary or secondary instruments. The objective of the second project, "All Hands on Deck", was to purchase percussion instruments and equipment in order to have enough instruments for all percussion students to play at the same time. 

WVHS Offers Music Theory Class

Walker Valley High School offers a music theory class for students interested in studying the elements of music composition. Enrolled students learn about a variety of topics such as scales, chords, and form. Learners also engage in a number of composition projects which enable them to create music using several types of professional music software such as Sibelius, Ableton Live, and Garageband.

The music in the following videos were created by students as part of the film scoring project. Students are provided a selection of video clips from which they will chose one as the basis for their project. Students then import the video into the Sibelius music notation software and then begin composing the music.
